Margaretha was from the German state of Hessen and the village of Semd. Jakob Friedrich Zeisset was farming with his father and then with his brothers at Sindolsheim. Jakob and Margaretha were married in the church at Adelsheim. They then moved to Kreuzfeld where they had their children and raised their family.







Floor plan of the new home, built in 1870. The entry door was on the right side by the stairs. A short hall led to the kitchen with its external oven and a pantry. On the front of the home was the parlor which led into the parents bedroom and a nursery. Upstairs were rooms for the children.
