Through an Alvin Zeiset who is a chemist in the Bureau of Vital Statistics in Washington, Paul Zeisset has recently uncovered some information about a Pennsylvania German family of Zeisets who trace their ancestry to an 1840 immigrant from the state of Baden in Germany named George Zeiset. The family is Mennonite (as our own grandparents were) and they have all been farmers and have lived in that one area, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania except this man who is a chemist and two who have come to Kansas, one in McPherson and the other in Hutchinson. They have also learned from a Pennsylvania Mennonite who recently attended an international Mennonite conference in Baden, Baden, Germany that there was a minister by the name of Zeiset present at that conference. The Pennsylvania Zeisets have known such name spelling variations as Zeisert but not Zeisset. We may yet learn some interesting things from this family in Pennsylvania
